



Swimming

PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR SWIMMING GEAR EVERY DAY (except Friday) THIS WEEK AND NEXT!

It is also important that students bring their own goggles (if required) and wear sun screen to school. Students will be given the opportunity to re-apply sun screen before going to the pool. It is also imperative that all property is labelled, especially swimmers, towels and goggles.

With regard to goggles, parents and students are advised that students will not be allowed to wear them for swimming assessments. This is because research is indicating that children generally do not have goggles on when they get into difficulty in water (eg pools, rivers, dams, channels) and that for assessment to be accurate and informed, goggles should not be worn.

Due to swimming, our regular timetable will vary for the next fortnight (excluding Friday). Students will have lunch from 10.45 to 11.30. (Huge thanks to the BHS canteen who have been very cooperative with this). The middle session will last from 11.30 to 12.30, when students will break for recess and the first group of students will depart for the pool at 1pm. The last group will return in time for the afternoon buses. The first group at the pool comprises 2/3B and K/1R, the middle group 4/5/6M and K/1B and the final group 4/5/6R and 1/2D. Huge thanks to those parents who have been able to volunteer their time and expertise in assisting with our swimming program this year. We couldn't do this without your help!
