Weed Warriors

Mr Battenally made a return visit to Mrs Barker's room last Tuesday, to finish up Year 3's part in breeding caterpillars as a natural control for the weed called 'Hoare Hound.'

The students became concerned that having the experiment taking place in an air-conditioned room and away from sunlight would not be conducive to breeding the caterpillars. However, when Mr Battenally and the students began to inspect the plants more closely, about one dozen caterpillars were observed. It was decided that because of the strong possibility of snakes being present in the 'release' area, that the students would not go with Mr Battenally to release the caterpillars. There was considerable discussion on the advantages of biological pest control as opposed to eradication using chemicals. The students demonstrated a pleasing understanding in this area. Thank you to Mr Battenally for making the time to include us in this valuable programme.
